NFPA Objective

National Fire Protection Association Objectives are major competencies and Job Performance Requirements (JPR) within a professional qualifications standard that learners must acquire before successful completion of voluntary testing and certification. To attain these competencies, the OFMEM is offering flexible training delivery models centered on being accessible, attainable, and affordable.

Requisite Knowledge

As defined in published NFPA Professional Qualifications Standards, Requisite Knowledge is "Fundamental knowledge one must have in order to perform a specific task". This can be acquired by referring to the various suggested readings described below. Information used to construct multiple choice test questions in the Provincial Certification Exam for FIRE SERVICE INSTRUCTOR II are derived from these materials.

Requisite Skills

As defined in published NFPA Professional Qualifications Standards, Requisite Skills are "The essential skills one must have in order to perform a specific task". This can be acquired by referring to the various suggested readings described below along with the latest version of the Office of the Fire Marshal and Emergency Management's Skills Sheets Booklet for FIRE SERVICE INSTRUCTOR II. This booklet is used by Provincial Examiners to test Requisite Skill requirements for those voluntarily seeking certification to NFPA 1041, Chapter 5, 2012 Edition.

A mark of 70% or better is required to receive a "Pass" on the knowledge test.
